**UTA SEEKS INPUT ON FUTURE SOUTH JORDAN AND SANDY CITY  
CIRCULATOR BUS SYSTEM**

SOUTH JORDAN, UT –June 5, 2014

Circulator busses are better known in other parts of the country as fast and consistent ways to travel between transit hubs and major destinations, but they could be coming to parts of South Jordan and Sandy in the future. The Utah Transit Authority is studying the potential for a circulator bus system that would connect FrontRunner and TRAX in the rapidly growing southwest portion of the Salt Lake Valley. An open house is being hosted by UTA on Wednesday June 11, 2014 from 5:00 to 7:00 pm at the Gale Center of History and Culture located at 10300 S. Beckstead Lane in South Jordan.

The study is designed to determine transportation purpose and need, transit alternatives and the identification of preferred alternatives relative to transit needs for the area. In Sandy, the area being examined is from 9000 South on the north and 10600 South on the south and from the Sandy Civic Center TRAX station (115 E. Sego Lilly) on the east to South Jordan FrontRunner station (10351 South Jordan Gateway) on the west. In South Jordan the study area is from the South Jordan FrontRunner station (10351 South Jordan Gateway) on the east to 1300 West on the west and from 9800 South on the north and 11400 South on the south.

“This is a critical opportunity for our residents who are interested in transit options to make their voices heard” South Jordan Mayor Dave Alvord said.
