### **South Jordan City Hosts Grand Opening of New Road 4800 West Ribbon Cutting Ceremony**

**SOUTH JORDAN, UT – November 13, 2014**, South Jordan City hosts a ribbon cutting ceremony to celebrate the grand opening of their newest road, 4800 West. This new road will cross Bingham Creek and connect Old Bingham Highway to Kennecott’s Daybreak development; the road will also provide access to Glenmore residential area and golf course from 4800 West.

“We’re pleased to open this new road; this is a great addition the city and will provide better access to developments in the surrounding area,” said South Jordan Mayor David Alvord.

Completion of 4800 West will provide less travel time heading north and south and will draw traffic away from Skye Drive. The road spans about ¾ miles long and will accommodate two travel lanes, a center median and bike lanes. This project also provides a critical link to the Mid-Jordan Light rail station at 4800 West and Old Bingham Highway.


