

Stained Glass Kite Instructions

See back of sheet for sample images.

Remember to have an adult help you with the scissors and the contact paper.

- First, make the frame for your kite. Use the black construction paper strips to make a diamond shaped kite with cross bars. You can trim the strips as needed.
- Take one sheet of contact paper and peel the protective layer off. Lay the paper on a table with the sticky side up. Have an adult to help with this step!
- Carefully place your kite frame onto the sticky contact paper. Once the frame is on the paper, you won't be able to move it, so work slowly.
- Use the small tissue paper squares to fill in the sections of your kite in a design you like.

TURN OVER...

- After the sections are filled in, remove the protective layer from the 2nd piece of contact paper.
- Place the second sheet of contact paper sticky side down on top of your kite.
- Trim off the excess contact paper and hang your kite in a window!

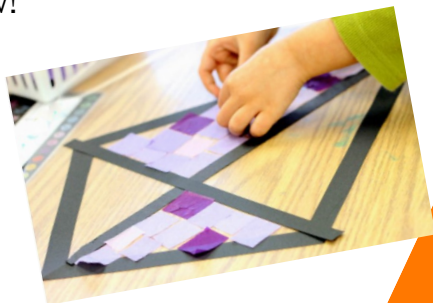
