Re: GRAMA Records Request received in the South Jordan City Recorder's Office on 05/20/2019.

Request:

1. How old is the South Jordan water system?
2. At what age do you try to upgrade/replace the parts and components of your system?
3. How many water main breaks have you experienced in the past 3 yrs. 2016 to present?
4. Have you experienced any other water supply issues in that same timeframe? Such as an accidental release, mandatory boil order, contamination issues, etc.
5. Are there currently certain areas of most concern, such as corrosive soil, older pipes, etc.

Reply:

1. **The City's water system has been delivering water for decades. The oldest components of the system are approximately 40 years old. However, the majority of the water distribution system is newer, due to growth and major water system upgrades that have taken place since 2006.**
2. **The City uses both age and current condition to evaluate and make replacement decisions. Some pipe that is older may still be in good shape and have years of service life left.**
3. **We have had 17 water line breaks for the time-period referenced.**
4. **None**
5. **No. The City spends \$2,000,000+ annually on water pipe replacement. This allows the water distribution system to be reliable and water customers experiencing minimal downtime for water service.**
