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CITY OF SOUTH JORDAN TO HOLD COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT HEARING

SOUTH JORDAN, UT – Residents and interested parties will get a chance to comment on South Jordan’s plans for the use of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds at a virtual public hearing on April 21, 2020.

“This is the public’s chance to review our plan for the spending of federal dollars where it’s needed most,” said Katie Olson, South Jordan’s CDBG administrator.

If in-person public hearings can be held by that date, the meeting will be held at South Jordan City Council Chambers (1600 W. Towne Center Drive, South Jordan UT 84095). The method in which the hearing will be conducted will be posted on the April 21, 2020 City Council agenda, which will be published by the end of the day April 17, 2020.

The Consolidated Plan draft will be available for public review and comment from April 7, 2020 through May 7, 2020 on the City’s website (<https://www.sjc.utah.gov/finance/CDBG>). Printed copies are available by request. The City will provide reasonable accommodations, including necessary interpretation. Persons with accessibility or interpretation needs should contact the City Manager’s staff at 801-446-4357, at least 24 hours prior to the meeting. “The primary objective of the CDBG program is to develop viable urban communities, by providing **decent housing, suitable living environments and expanded economic opportunities**, particularly for those with **low and moderate incomes**,” said Olson. “This plan helps us be accountable to HUD for having fulfilled those objectives.”

Once the five-year plan is adopted, CDBG will be awarded through a grant application process each year, according to the goals established.

Attendees will be allowed to join via phone or video, using Zoom phone and video conferencing. Note, public comment will be accessed through video conferencing, and a participant must have their video on and working to speak. Those who join via phone may listen, but not comment. Ability to connect and comment is dependent on an individual’s internet connection, not the City. If you want to ensure your comments are taken, please have them submitted in writing to the CDBG Administrator at kolson@sjc.utah.gov, by 3:00 p.m. on April 21, 2020.
